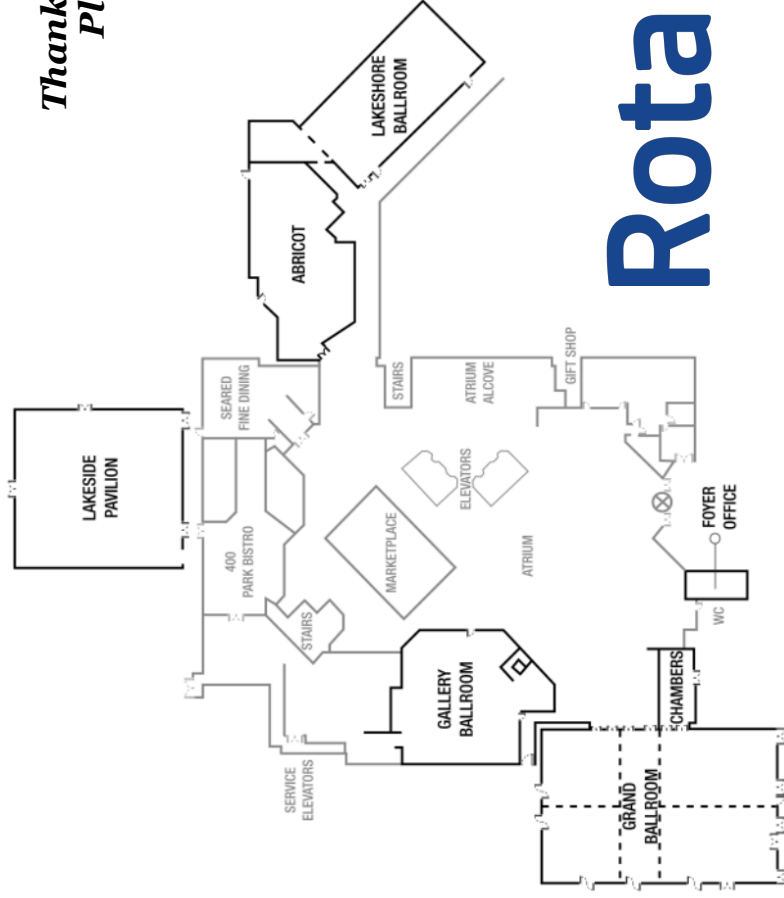
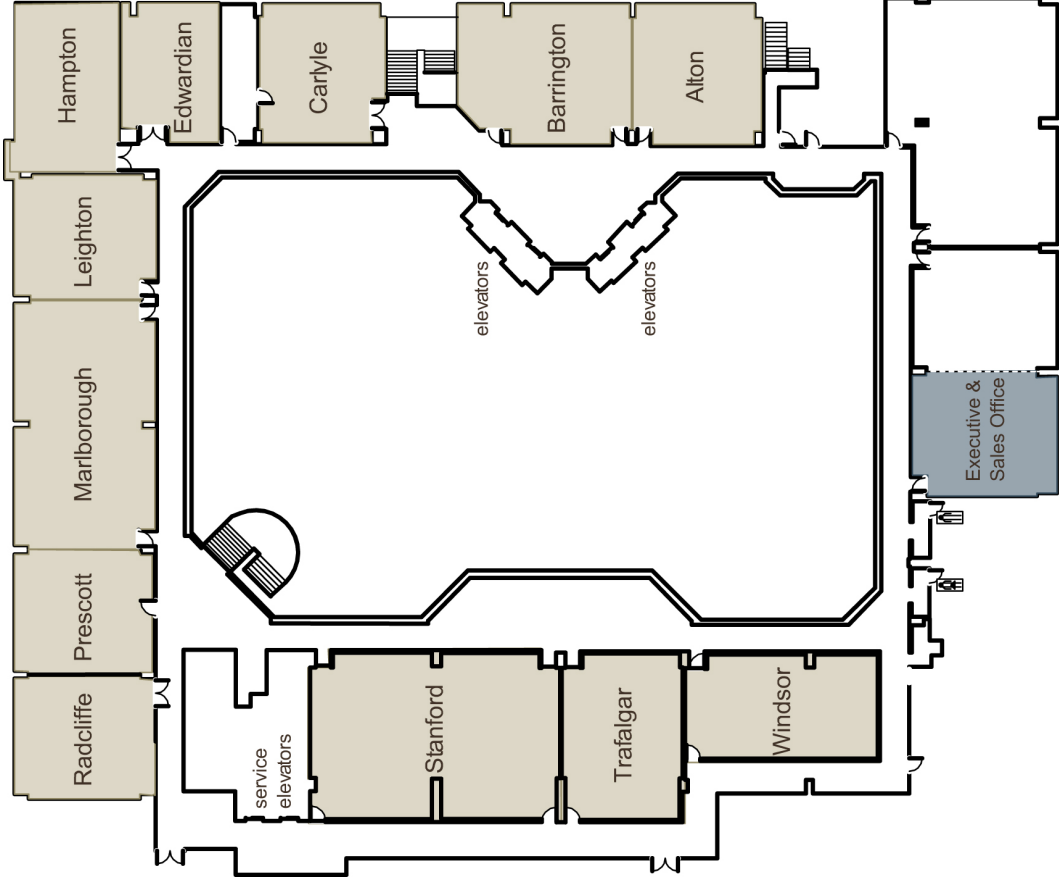

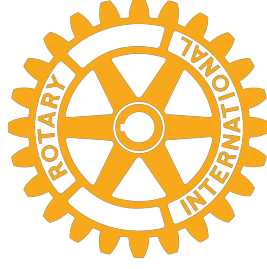

Ed Futa

Past General Secretary and Chief Operating Officer of Rotary International and The Rotary Foundation, 1999-2011



As General Secretary and Chief Operating Officer of Rotary International and The Rotary Foundation, Ed Futa managed operations and led a staff of more than 650 for one of the world's largest global humanitarian service organization.

Ed comes from Honolulu, Hawaii, where he was president of an international marketing consulting firm. He served on the Board of Governors of the YMCA, a mediator in the Neighborhood Justice Center of Honolulu, and a member of the Bishop's Advisory Council of the Roman Catholic Dioceses of Honolulu.

He is a keynote speaker at many Rotary International events including club and district conferences and international assemblies and conventions.

He served as 2011-15 Member of the Cardinal's Finance Committee of the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Chicago; General Chair of the 2013 Lisbon Rotary International Convention; 2012-13 Vice Chair of the Rotary International Peace Forums in Berlin, Honolulu, and Hiroshima; 2013-15 one of 5 alternate representatives to the United Nations, New York City. He was Dean of RI Representative Corps 2013-16 which includes RI appointed representatives to the United Nations offices in New York City, Geneva, and Vienna; and many associated agencies.

He is a member of the Arch C. Klumph society of the Rotary Foundation.

He is a recipient of the Citation for Meritorious Service and the Distinguished Service Award presented by the Trustees of The Rotary Foundation.

Mark's wife, Gay, is an attorney at the same firm and a charter member and Past President of the Rotary Club of Decatur Daybreak, Alabama. Both Mark and Gay are Paul Harris Fellows, Benefactors, and Major Donors of The Rotary Foundation and members of its Bequest Society. They have two daughters, one goddaughter, and two grandsons.
