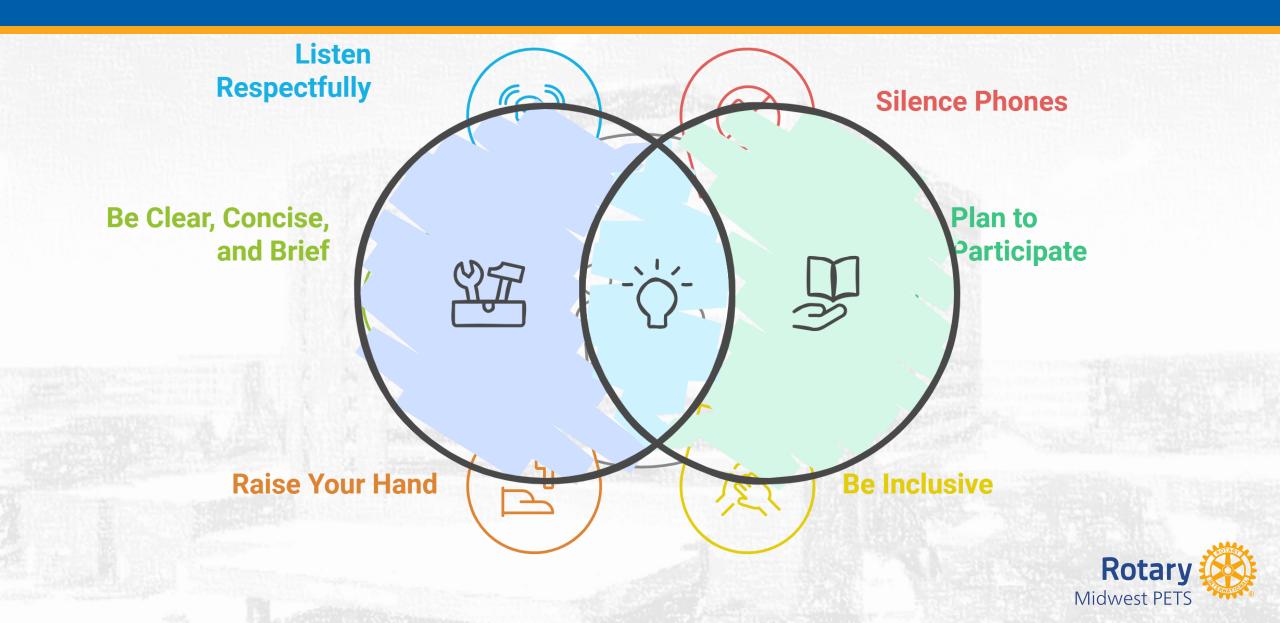

## The Rotary Foundation ==== Your club's foundation

- Your club, area, or district may have its own foundation
- These are separate, distinct entities
- Your club is probably not a 501(c)(3), so make sure you are fundraising correctly

### **Mission**

### To enable Rotary members to advance world understanding, goodwill, and peace through the improvement of health, the support of education, and the alleviation of poverty.

# Why are Goals Important?



Having goals, and working towards them, can help your club be more organized, accomplish milestones that are meaningful to your club members, and provide a sense of accomplishment once achieved.

# The Rotary Foundation

### What does TRF do?

 Money from TRF funds our projects, including Global and District Grants, Peace Scholars, Polio Plus, and Disaster Relief Grants


### How does TRF work?

- TRF Trustees make decisions on how to invest the money
- Money donated to the Annual Fund-SHARE comes back to your district as District Designated Funds (DDF)

### Why is donating to TRF important?

- Foundation, Public Image, and Membership all work together to increase our impact
- TRF supports our clubs and Rotarians to make the changes that we want to see in the world

# The Rotary Foundation's Programs

### **District Grants**

- Club money gets matched with DDF
- Match amount varies by district

### **Global Grants**

- Club money matched with DDF, DDF matched 80% by The World Fund
- Must have partner club in a different country

### **Global Scholars and Peace Fellows**

- Global Scholars are funded by DDF from your district
- Peace Fellows don't cost your club or district anything but time!



# The Rotary Foundation's Programs



### **Disaster Relief Grants**

- Quick response to disasters, such as flooding, earthquakes, wars
- Funded through the Rotary Disaster Response Fund

### **Programs of Scale Grants**

- One awarded per year
- Support member-led, evidenced-based programs that have already demonstrated success

### **Vocational Training Teams**

- Group of professionals that travel to another country to learn or to teach
- Align with Rotary's Areas of Focus

# Must Do's for PE's

1. Make sure that your outgoing club president has updated club officers in my.rotary

### 2. Make sure your club is Grant-Qualified

- Different standards to lead vs participate in District and Global Grants
- When? Usually by mid-May to get a District Grant
- Qualification can vary between districts, may include:
  - \$100/member average giving to The Annual Fund-SHARE
  - o Entering goals in The Goal Center
  - Sign MOU
  - o Attend Grant Management Seminar
  - PE attends PETS

# Must Do's as Club President



# 1. Update my.rotary with new officers before the end of your year as club president

### 2. Ensure grant reporting is submitted on time

• One club being late on reporting can hold up the rest of the district in getting grants approved

# Nice to do as Club President

- 1. Set Foundation Goals in The Goal Center\*
- 2. Encourage your club members to donate to The Rotary Foundation
- 3. Schedule your DRFC as a speaker
- 4. Fundraise for Polio+
- 5. Designate a Club Foundation Chair and/or Committee
- 6. Update your club's goals and progress throughout the year
- 7. Upload your club's service projects into The Service Center

#### PRO-TIP: DELEGATE DELEGATE DELEGATE

- Delegating tasks gets things off your own plate and gets other club members involved
- Your club members WANT to help and be involved
- It's a win-win

- Your outgoing president MUST update officers for the new year on BOTH platforms before July 1st


